Coronavirus Catch-Up Funding

- Catch-up funding has been used to employ 2 maths and 2 English tutors, 2 TLRs for literacy used in development activities for Years 7,8 and 9 and a GCSEPod site licence for two years.
- We will be employing an English tutor and continuing support with a maths tutor in 2021-22.
- Tutors work with students across years 7 to 13.
- **KS5 Catch-up**. In KS5 the catch up tutors worked with eight Year 12 and 13 students to support them with re-sit GCSE maths and/or English.
- Year 11 Catch-up. 116 students in the Year 11 Catch Up funding cohort, who made more progress from the Autumn Mock Exams than their non-catch up peers.
- Year 10 Catch-up students have made similar increases in overall attainment 8 and progress 8 to the non-catch up students. In English and maths specifically where the catch up support has been targeted, students have made larger increases in the %9-5 and %9-4 measures than the non-catch up students.
- Year 9 Catch-up. There has been a 6% increase in the proportion of students making expected progress in English compared to a 1% increase for the whole cohort. There has been a 13% increase in the proportion of students making expected progress in maths compared to a 0% change for the whole Year 8 cohort. There were 65 students included in the catch up cohort in Year 9.
- Year 8 Catch-up. There has been an 18% increase in the proportion of students making expected progress in English compared to a 1% increase for the whole cohort. There has been a 22% increase in the proportion of students making expected progress in maths compared to a 0% change for the whole Year 8 cohort. There were 82 students included in the catch up cohort in Year 8.
- Year 7 Catch-up. There has been a 10% increase in the proportion of students making expected
 progress in English compared to a 1% increase for the whole cohort. There has been a 6% decrease
 in the proportion of students making expected progress in maths compared to a 0% change for the
 whole Year 7 cohort. There were 97 students included in the catch up cohort in Year 7.
