The Big Question

Following on from the Big Ashlawn Survey, we are pleased to share another development we have been working on in response to the comments we received.

You Said

Reports don't always give the detail that we would like about our child's progress and attitude to learning.

We Did

Firstly, new commentary has been developed that will provide more detail about your child's learning behaviours. This has been implemented with immediate effect and all reports now feature this new style commentary.

Next, we have started to trial a new reporting approach for Key Stage 3 based on the assessments derived from the revised curriculum plans. New style assessment information will give information about the skills and knowledge that your child is showcasing and make clear the next stage and the skills and knowledge that they will need to show in order to move to the next level of achievement. We hope that you will find it useful to see the link between assessments and the curriculum by accessing our curriculum information on our website.

We are trialling this with Year 7 Maths and English and we hope that parents in Year 7 will give us feedback when they receive reports about their child's progress later this half term.





What is the role of the police at Ashlawn and in our local community?

We would like to take this opportunity to introduce to you our link police officer in school. PC Naomi Elcock has worked with us for the past 3 years and is often seen walking around our school. Research shows that when police officers work with schools, all key stakeholders (teachers, students, parents and the local community) benefit from the following:

- Increased accessibility (e.g. between pupils, the police and schools)
- Improved relationships (between police and schools, or police and pupils)
- An increased sense of safety for pupils, teachers and the community
- Improved attendance
- · Raised achievement
- Reduced levels of offending behaviour and poor behaviour in school.

PC Elcock is keen to be in school as much as possible and we urge our students to speak to her if they have any concerns or questions. If students have a specific question please let Mrs Pountney know and she will contact her for a response.

How does PC Elcock support us at School?

PC Elcock will:

- *Liaise weekly with Mrs Pountney regarding safeguarding issues.
- * Talk to staff and students about staying safe in the community.
- Meet with students who want support with staying safe in the community.
- * Run the Knife Arch Awareness days in school.
- Support the HUB in interventions such as drug awareness, ASB, knife crime, theft etc...
- Support school with medical emergencies where a young person is considered to be vulnerable.
- Regularly update us on issues we need to be aware/ vigilant of. Update us on criminal cases which involve students in our school.



Attendance & Punctuality

Good attendance and punctuality to school is vital if students are to succeed and reach their full potential. Every day that a student is late will impact their learning time in school.

We monitor attendance and punctuality very closely in order to ensure that ALL students arrive at school on time, ready to learn.

We expect ALL students to be in school by 8.40am, ready to start form time at 8.45am. If students arrive late to form time then they will be marked as late regardless of what time they were on site. If students arrive late on 2 occasions or more then they will attend a same day detention for 15 minutes.

Although we want every student to achieve 100% attendance we understand that there are times when they may not be able to come to school as they are really unwell. If this happens it is vital that you contact school via EDULINK or by phoning 01788 532831.

PLEASE DO NOT EMAIL INDIVIDUAL TEACHERS OR THEIR HEAD OF YEAR.

If at any time you feel that you need support with your child's attendance or punctuality then you must talk to us.

Your child's Form Tutor or Head of Year are here to support them throughout their time in school.
