STAYING SAFE THIS SUMMER – ENJOY BUT BE SMART!

As the summer holidays begin, we know many of you are looking forward to a well-earned rest, fun with friends, and time outdoors.

Whether you're heading to the park, going out on your bike, or cooling off near water, it's important to enjoy the break safely.

Here are some key reminders to help you stay safe and make the most of your summer:

Out and about – trust your instincts

Spending time in parks or around town with friends is great but always stay aware of your surroundings.

- Stick with people you trust, and avoid isolated areas, especially after dark.
- If someone or something makes you feel uncomfortable, walk away and call a trusted adult straight away.
- You can also contact Childline (0800 1111) or use the 'safety mode' on Snapchat or Google's emergency SOS features if you're in danger.
- If you feel unsafe, you can also go into a shop or public building and ask for help.



Sun safety – protect your skin

Spending time outside in the fresh air is good for us, but too much sun can lead to painful burns and long-term damage to your skin.

- Always wear sunscreen (SPF 30 or higher) - even on cloudy days.
- Reapply every two hours, especially if you're sweating or swimming.
- Try to avoid the strongest sun between 11 am and 3 pm and wear a hat and sunglasses for extra protection.

Getting sunburnt isn't just uncomfortable - it increases your risk of skin cancer later in life. So, enjoy the sunshine - but respect it too.



Road and cycle safety – out on foot or by bike, keep these tips in mind:

- Use crossings, not shortcuts. Accidents often happen when people cross roads in a rush or between parked cars.
- If you're cycling, always wear a helmet, check your brakes, and use lights/reflectors if you'll be out late.
- In 2023, over 2,000 young cyclists were seriously injured on UK roads. Many of these accidents could have been avoided with the right gear and awareness.



Water safety – lakes, rivers and quarries

When the weather gets hot, it's tempting to jump into lakes, rivers, or even quarries - but it's extremely dangerous.

- Water may look calm, but there can be strong undercurrents, hidden debris, and the risk of cold-water shock, which can stop your muscles from working and make it hard to breathe.
- Tragically, around 50 young people drown every year in the UK, most in unsupervised, open water.

Stick to supervised swimming areas like public pools, and if you're ever near water:

- Don't go in alone
- Never jump from heights
- Call 999 if someone's in trouble - don't try to rescue them yourself



Stay away from railway lines

Railways are not shortcuts or places to explore - they are incredibly dangerous.

- Trains are faster and quieter than they seem.
- The electricity used to power some tracks is always on, even if no trains are in sight.
- In 2023, over 40 serious injuries were reported due to trespassing on railways.

Stay off railways and stay safe.

“PROUD DOESN’T EVEN BEGIN TO DESCRIBE IT...”: ASHLAWN SCHOOL APPLAUDED BY OFSTED

Ashlawn School has been widely praised by Ofsted following a full inspection in June that reviewed all aspects of school life.

In the last graded inspection in 2022, the school was given the lowest possible grading, but this time the inspectors found that there had been a “profound shift in culture”, “significant improvement” and a community that is “working together...with even greater ambition for the school.”

As a result, the school has now been judged as Good in all areas – with many of the comments reflecting that Ashlawn is close to even better outcomes.

Paul Brockwell, Principal, said: “When I first walked through the doors in 2022, the potential in this school was tangible. With the Transforming Lives Educational Trust (TLET) we have systematically looked at how we can bring that promise to life in everything that we do – and the way that the community has responded to that challenge has been uplifting.

“There is not one element of this school that hasn’t moved forward with pace, and that is testament to the fact that we are all committed to one thing – and that is “our best, always”.

Inspectors noted that behaviour expectations are “high and clearly communicated”, lessons are “calm and purposeful”, the well-designed curriculum is “ambitious” and that pupils “work hard and achieve well”.

The Sixth Form received particular praise, with students “valuing the quality of their learning and wider experiences”. It was also noted that those in the sixth form are “impressively keen to contribute to the school community and are excellent role models.”

“The myriad of extra-curricular and enrichment opportunities” was also praised, as was the fact that “staff feel valued” and “parents talk positively about having their voice heard”.

Mr Brockwell added: “The most important thing is that our students shone throughout the inspection – and their attitudes, behaviours and successes are the best reflection of a school.”

TLET’s leadership was recognised for taking “decisive action” after the last inspection. Due to this, inspectors concluded “all areas for improvement have been addressed effectively”.



James Higham, CEO at TLET, said: “The last two and a half years have been significant for Ashlawn, and the whole team should be acknowledged for their collective efforts and commitment.

“No stone has been left unturned, and taking the relatively rare step of jumping two judgement grades in one inspection is testament to this.

It is an amazing feeling that I hope everyone associated with Ashlawn will feel part of - proud doesn’t even begin to describe it.

“This is, however, a step on a much bigger journey. There is more that we want to aspire to and achieve – and that is what makes the future for Ashlawn School so exciting.”

Our students have been making memories on some brilliant end of year trips this term!

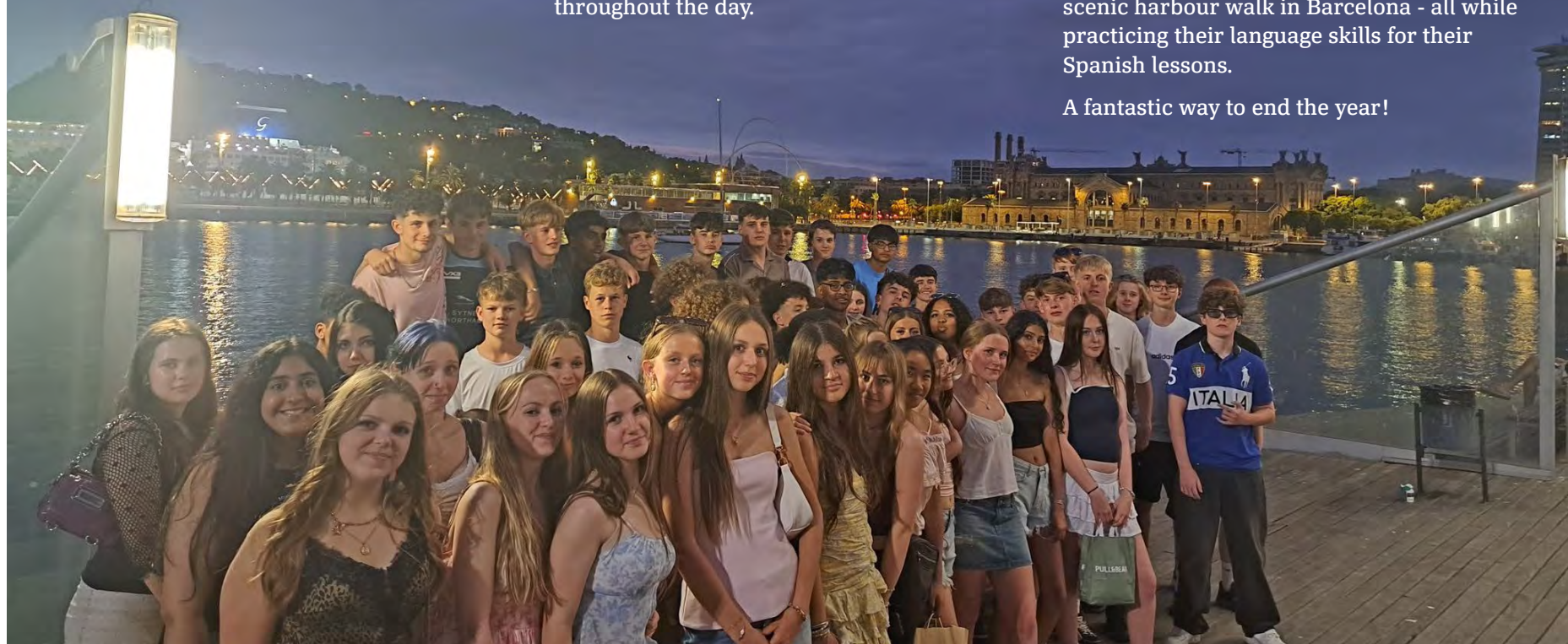

CELEBRATING THIS YEAR'S EXPEDITIONS


This year we have had high expedition completion rates across all award levels.

Bronze Qualifying Expedition – Year 9

Our Year 9 Cohort A and Cohort B students recently completed their Bronze qualifying expedition, building on their successful practice expeditions.

Over two gruelling days with maps in hand, they navigated challenging routes, putting their route planning and navigation skills to the test. Their efforts paid off as every student completed the full route, reflecting excellent progression since the practice and were ready to continue to complete the remaining sections of their Bronze awards.

Students should be aiming to complete their Bronze Award in full by Christmas 2025.





We have received lots of praise for Ashlawn students' attitudes, teamwork and perseverance and the expedition assessors even commented on the excellent team spirit and maturity shown.

Silver Qualifying Expedition – Year 10

Our Year 10 Silver participants took on extended routes across the Derbyshire and Peak District countryside. They tackled steep ascents, hot weather, and longer walking distances. Along the way, they honed navigation skills, camp-craft, teamwork, leadership, and perseverance - qualities essential to progress through the Silver Award.

Students can now focus their efforts on completing their Volunteering, Physical and Skills sections of the Award, aiming to complete these by February 2026.






Here's a look back at their achievements – and what made 2025 an outstanding year for DofE at Ashlawn.

All of our DofE students should be so proud of what they have achieved so far!

Gold Qualifying Expedition – Year 12

Our Year 12 Gold participants truly went above and beyond. They embarked on extended expeditions in the Keswick area of the Lake District. Nine Year 12 students demonstrated the key expedition skills, being fully self-sufficient as a cohort, undertaking their Gold DofE Qualifying Expedition.

During the expedition, students faced all weathers - sun, wind, rain - navigating complex terrain under real-world conditions. This full-length expedition challenged every aspect of the DofE Gold framework: planning, endurance, leadership, self-reliance, and true character. As well as the expeditions, their volunteering, physical and skills sections, participants will now undertake a week-long residential that they will plan themselves, working with other young adults that they have never met before in order to complete their Gold award.

YEAR 7 AND 8 TRIP TO THE WARWICKSHIRE SECONDARY BOOK AWARD

When not competing, many relaxed in the shade, cheering on their friends and enjoying the atmosphere. It has been a fantastic celebration of sport.



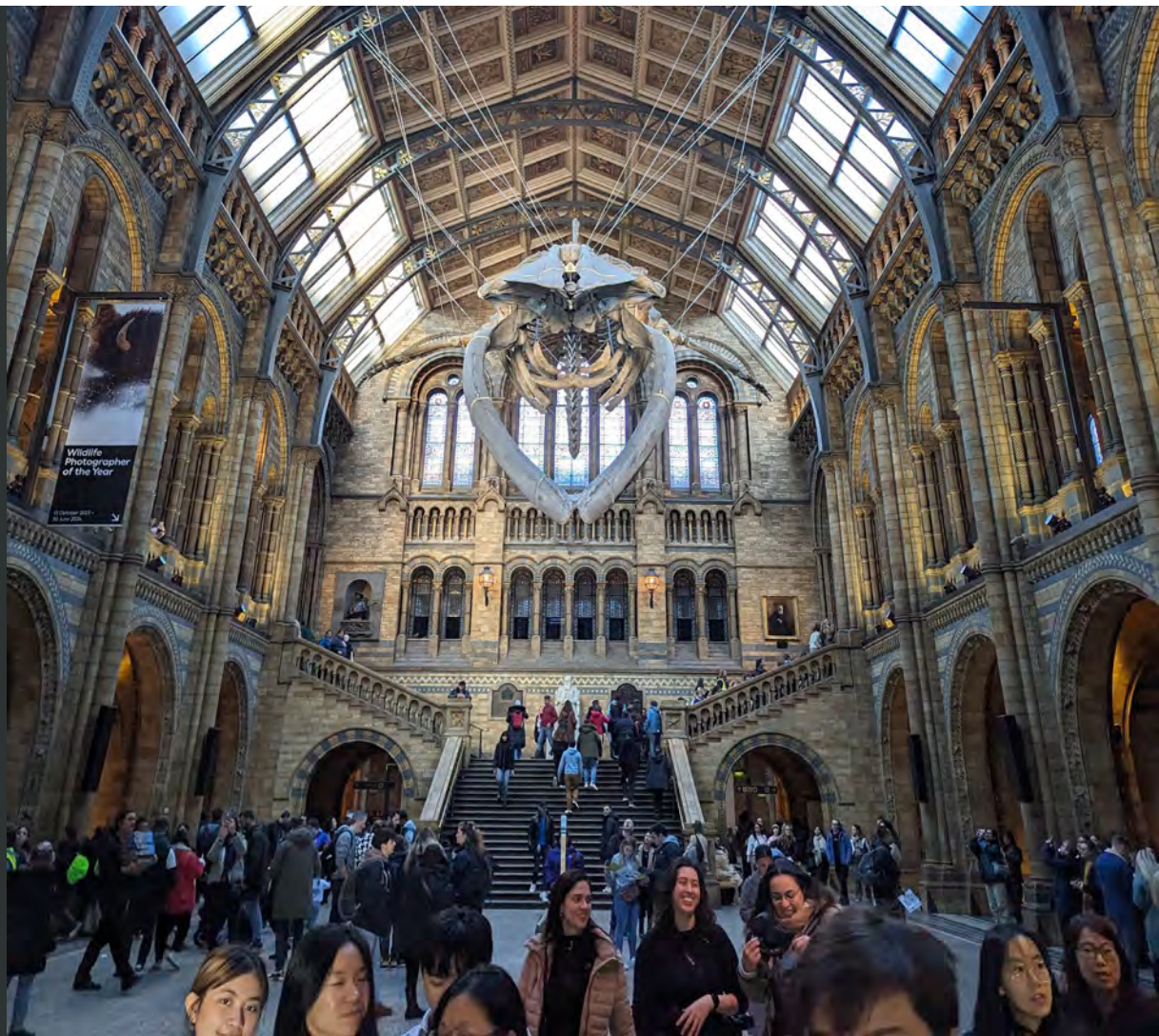
SCIENCE

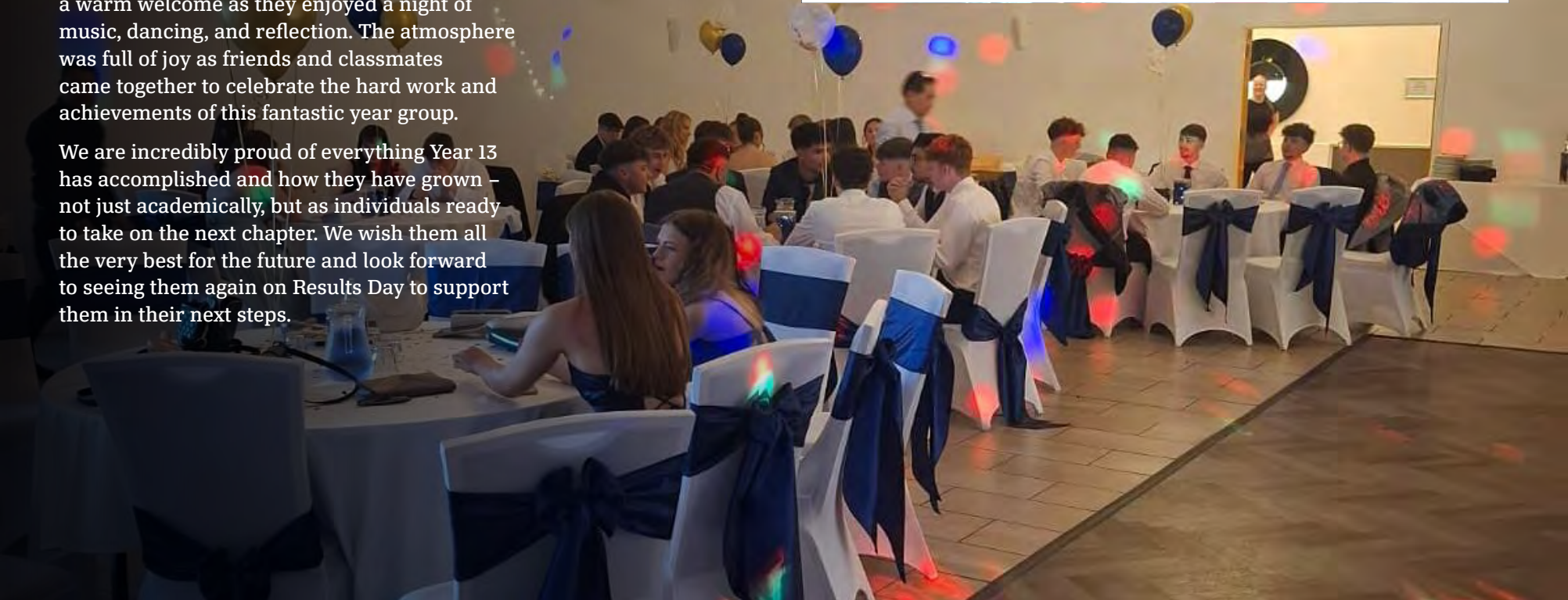
YEAR 13 PROM

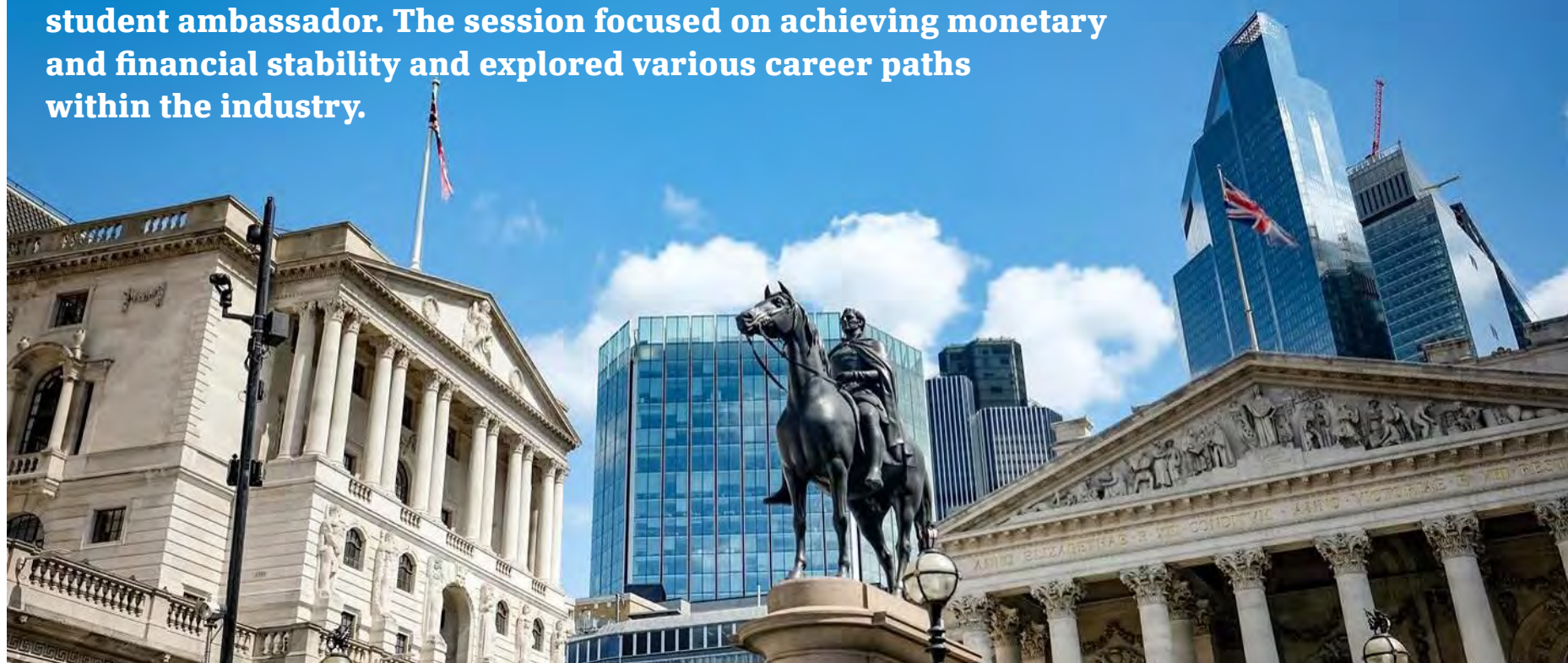
YEAR 12 PERSONAL STATEMENT TALK – UNIVERSITY OF LEICESTER

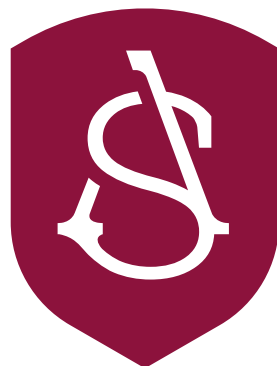
