Message from the Principal

The first part of term has flown by. We are now over half way through the first half term of the academic year and have much to celebrate.

Our Year 7 students have settled brilliantly, no doubt helped by the excellent summer school that they were able to attend in August. I have really enjoyed speaking to them and seeing their confidence grow. I have also enjoyed monitoring the number of achievement points awarded to students across the school. Year 7 and Year 8 are neck and neck with over 7500 points each - an average of about 30 achievement points per student!

As I mentioned last week, it has been wonderful to see the start of enrichment activities and if your child has not already done so, we would love them to choose an activity and get involved. Enrichment forms such an important part of school and we hope to expand on our offer in the future. The opportunities available to students at the current time have been sent as a separate attachment with this newsletter.

Next week we have the opportunity to showcase our school for prospective parents and Year 6 children. It has been fantastic to have so many students volunteer to support the evening. While many adaptations have had to be made to make our open evening safer for everyone, we have made the decision to continue with this event as it is such an important part of the transition process. Examples of our safety measures include releasing limited tickets through Eventbrite, moving the traditional Principal's address online (sent to ticket holders in advance) and requiring visitors to wear face coverings. Our open evening might be a little different this year , but we know that our visitors will get to know us because it is the people that make a school.

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
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Positive Parenting

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Advice for students cycling to school

- \checkmark Ride decisively and keep clear of the kerb.
- Look and signal to show drivers what you plan to do, make eye contact where possible \mathbf{V}
- \checkmark Avoid riding up the inside of vehicles, as you might not be seen.
- \checkmark If a vehicle is indicating to the left hang back at the junction to reduce the risk of a collision.
- If you love to wheelie then do it in a safe place such as the park.
- $\mathbf{1}$ Always use lights after dark or when visibility is poor.
- \checkmark Wear high-visibility and reflective clothing and accessories at all times
- $\sqrt{}$ Wear a correctly fitted cycle helmet that is securely fastened and conforms to current regulations.
- $\sqrt{}$ Rugby Borough council can help you plan your journey by providing maps showing dedicated paths and routes.
- \checkmark Where possible, try to maintain a safe distance when you cycle, for example when waiting at crossings and traffic lights
