Message from the Principal

We are really looking forward to our Sixth Form Open Evening next week. It is a wonderful chance for Year 11 students to consider their choices after Year 11 and to speak to staff about the courses on offer and, most importantly, what is involved in each course and what the course can lead to after the sixth form. We have worked hard to keep the event Covid-safe and ask that visitors book tickets in advance, wear masks on the night and keep socially distanced from others.

This is such a key period of time for Year 11 students. For the first time, they will be able to consider a variety of options for their future studies. As long as they meet the entry requirements, there are no limits to what our students can choose — apprenticeships, vocational courses and A Levels are all options and we want all of our students to have every 'door' open to them. While this is an exciting prospect, it can also be daunting. Some students know exactly what they want to do while others are not yet sure. It is completely normal to be unsure and we hope that the individual careers counselling session that all Year 11 students will have over the next few months will be helpful. Equally staff at school are available to discuss different career routes and how they got there — many of us started out in different careers or took different routes to further education.

I am sure that many of our parents and carers have similar stories. We urge you to discuss your career journeys with your children. It is important for them to know that they do not have to have everything all 'figured out' at this stage and therefore keeping their options open to them is important.



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COVID-19 VACCINATION CLINICS AVAILABLE FOR CHILDREN AGED 12-15

Coventry and Warwickshire Partnership

COVID-19 vaccination clinics are now available for children aged 12-15 who have not had their first dose.

Please note, if your young person has had a positive COVID-19 test, they need to wait 12 weeks before attending a vaccination clinic. The 12 weeks start from the date they had their PCR test. Please pre-book their vaccination via the links below at your preferred location. They will be given one dose of the Pfizer/BioNTech vaccine.

COVID-19 vaccination resources for children and young people are available on the government website in a variety of languages, Braille and Easy Read. These <u>resources</u> are to help children, young people and their parents or guardians make an informed decision about whether to take up the offer of the COVID-19 vaccination.

Vaccinating children can help stop the spread of COVID-19 to other people, including within schools. COVID-19 is usually mild in most children, but it can make some children unwell. One dose of a COVID-19 vaccine gives good protection against your child getting seriously ill.
