

Sixth Form Dress Code Policy

As Sixth Form students at Ashlawn School we take pride in being role models for the rest of the school and as such we commit to upholding the standards that are set for students for dress code.

The dress code is smart wear as below. The dress code applies to all students in Sixth Form, regardless of gender and identity.

What we should wear:

- Students can wear a blazer, jumper or close knit cardigan. The jumper can be either of round or V neck design. $\frac{3}{4}$ zip close knit jumpers are permitted without a logo, plain colours. *Hoodies are not permitted.*
- Trousers must be of a material that models the uniform of the lower school.
- Skirts or dresses should be no shorter than just above knee length, but can be of any style.
- With a shirt, ties should be worn by students at all times. In summer months, the Head of Sixth Form has the discretion to allow students to remove their ties where it is felt that this supports the comfort around school. Shirts can have either long or short sleeves but must be of one colour.
- Any blouse or top worn must cover the shoulders and the waist. They can be long or short sleeved.
- Shoes must be in keeping with the standards set for the lower school. They should be of a Chelsea shoe or boot design. *Trainers/Ugg boots are not acceptable.*
- A clear nose stud and single earring is allowed. Hair colour should be of a natural colour.
- Lanyards MUST be worn for safeguarding at all times.

Dress code will be monitored and checked by the Sixth form Tutors and Pastoral team. If the incorrect dress code is worn, the following procedure will be followed.

Stage 1 - Tutor will give reminder to the student, log and call home to inform Parent/Carers

Stage 2 - If a student continues to not comply with the dress code, the following will follow:

- If the student lives within walking distance, home will be contacted and the student will go home to change and return to school.
- If the student lives further away (more than 10 minute walk) or permission is not given to go home, the parent/carers will be asked to bring in the correct dress code.
- If this is not possible, the student will either be loaned an appropriate item or in case of refusal to wear or if an item is not available, the student will work off timetable in Sixth form under supervision for the day until the dress code is rectified.
- A repeated occurrence of non compliance will result in removal of the Passport (if held) and/or the student having all social time withdrawn until the dress code is rectified.
